## Towards a joint Counter Phishing Initiative

Tuesday 23 June 2026 – 13:30 – 17:00

### Rationale

Phishing remains one of the most significant cyber threats today. It has evolved from relatively simple scams into sophisticated operations that facilitate large-scale fraud, enable credential theft, and serve as a common entry point for ransomware attacks. By combining technology with social engineering techniques, attackers create a sense of urgency and trust that exploits human vulnerabilities. This evolution has contributed to the further industrialisation of the cybercrime ecosystem, in which phishing acts as a key enabler within the broader cybercriminal supply chain.

In response, recent innovations have increasingly focused on early detection and proactive disruption. After all, cybercriminals rarely conduct a single phishing attack; phishing is typically part of a larger, ongoing criminal operation. For this reason, efforts are expanding beyond individual incidents to connect the dots across campaigns, infrastructure, and threat actors, supporting more effective investigations and prosecutions.

Against this backdrop, **CFLW Live 2026** features key contributions from the **Bavarian Central Office for the Prosecution of Cybercrime (ZCB)**, the **Belgian Federal Police (FPG Limburg)**, and the **European Anti-Cybercrime Technology and Development Agency (EACTDA)**. The event brings together investigators, prosecutors, researchers, industry experts, and other stakeholders to share knowledge, explore investigative approaches, and identify disruption opportunities.

The event aims to strengthen the cybersecurity ecosystem through a collaborative counter-phishing initiative that targets the broader criminal infrastructure behind phishing campaigns. Ultimately, the goal is to break the economics of phishing by making it less effective, less scalable, and less profitable.
